# FRESHMAN & SOPHOMORE YEARS

### **EXPLORE SELF, MAJORS AND CAREERS**

Log into Cougar Pathway through AccessUH to find an on-campus job or schedule an appointment with a career counselor. Complete the Focus2 career planning assessment to learn about majors and occupations related to your interests, skills and values. Utilize online career planning resources: CareerOneStop, O\*Net Online and the Occupational Outlook Handbook.

**Explore career fields** through work, volunteering, job shadowing and informational interviews with professionals in fields of interest.

#### **GAIN EXPERIENCE AND MAKE CONNECTIONS**

Visit **Get Involved through Access UH** to for on-campus involvement opportunities; search based on interests, majors and occupations.

**Attend career fairs** and **meet and greets** to practice communication skills and find jobs and internships.

Meet with a faculty member, visit the Office of Undergraduate Research and search in Cougar Pathway to learn about **research opportunities on campus**. Gain experience through a **summer experience** such as an internship, part-time or full-time job, study abroad or volunteer work.

#### **CREATE PROFESSIONAL DOCUMENTS**

# JUNIOR AND SENIOR YEARS

### PREPARE TO APPLY FOR JOBS AND GRADUATE SCHOOL

**Attend UCS workshops** to strengthen job search skills such as resume writing, interviewing, salary negotiation and networking.

**Research graduate school programs** including testing and admission deadlines; create a document to track activity.

**Schedule a mock interview** with a career counselor to practice and get feedback on your interview skills.

Ask three people to serve as references; share your resume and updates on job and graduate school applications.

**Organize your job search** and track your activity including who you meet, where you apply, status of applications and more.

Ask family, friends professors and past employers about **internship** and job leads.

### GAIN EXPERIENCE AND MAKE CONNECTIONS

Join a local chapter of a national organization.

**Maintain knowledge of industry trends** by reviewing current professional literature and news.

**Secure a leadership role** through work, volunteering or on-campus involvement.

**Create a LinkedIn profile**; connect with peers, employers and groups of interest.

#### PREPARE FOR A TRANSITION

**Build a professional wardrobe** and gather industry appropriate attire. Visit UCS to rent a suit or a referral for free attire.

Utilize University Career Services free for six months after graduation.



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
